Hiram House Camp 2021 Overnight Camp



Hiram House is continuing to take actions to lower the risk of COVID-19 spread at camp. We are following guidance from The American Camp Association as well as the CDC. Our camp program will have a mix of campers/staff who are vaccinated and unvaccinated. We will continue to use multiple prevention strategies to help protect our camp family at all times, which includes children under the age of 12. We appreciate your patience and thank you in advance for following our guidance and helping to keep our campers and staff safe this summer.

Camper Drop Off/Pick Up

- Prior to your campers first day we ask that your child have a **NEGATIVE COVID test** within 72 hours of coming to camp. Please bring documentation with you at drop off.
- When you arrive at camp, all campers will have their temperatures taken and screened for Covid-19 symptoms.
- Only 1 member of the family at the check in table.
- Only 2 family member will be allowed to accompany their camper down into camp. All others must wait in their car or the parking lot.
- Masks will be required while visiting camp.
- Campers will be asked to go directly to the Camp Nurse and then their assigned cabin.
- If your camper has temperature of 100 or higher they will be asked to return home. Once the fever has been controlled for over 24 hours without medication, the camper is able to return to camp, unless there are additional symptoms.
- Late arrival and early pick up, campers can be dropped off at the office. They will be screened in the office before the parent/guardian leaves. All campers must wear a mask while waiting in the office for their counselor.
- Last day of camp, campers will be brought up to their parent(s) with their belongings. Family members will not be allowed down in camp at pick up.

If your Camper is Sick or has Covid-19

- If your camper arrives at camp with a fever of 100 degrees or higher they will be asked to return home.
- Once the fever has been controlled for over 24 hours without medication, the camper is able to return to camp, unless there are additional symptoms.
- If your child has been diagnosed with Covid-19, we ask that the child stay home and follow all CDC and your doctors guidelines about when to return to activities.
- If your child has had **CLOSE CONTACT** with someone infected with Covid-19 they will not be allowed to come to camp.
- If a camper becomes ill while at camp, Hiram House will inform all families that there has been a positive case at camp. The infected camper will be sent home.

Office Visits

- Parents who need to go to the office, we ask that you drop off your camper(s) first and then park in the main lot and come to the office.
- The office will be one person at a time and please follow social distancing while waiting in line. Hand sanitizer will be available inside.
- We ask that you wear a mask while inside the office.
- To alleviate office traffic you can call and place money on your campers Camp Store account at anytime. (216) 831-5045
- The office is also open Mon-Fri 8:30am-5pm to drop off any forms prior to the start of camp.

Face Masks

- Staff and Campers who are **FULLY VACCINATED** do not need to wear masks at camp, except where indicated below.
- **INDOORS:** Masks will be worn indoors except for eating, sleeping or showering. We recognize that fully vaccinated individuals do not need to wear masks indoors, however, Hiram House will be supportive of all campers or staff who are unvaccinated. Particularly in areas of substantial to high transmission.
- **OUTDOORS:** In general, people do not need to wear masks when outdoors. However, in areas of substantial to high transmission, campers and staff who are unvaccinated will wear masks in crowded outdoor settings or during activities that involve substantial close contact with others who are unvaccinated. (ie. sitting around a picnic table playing a game)

Living Quarters

- Campers will be sleeping every other bunk so to keep a 6 foot distance at bedtime.
- Cabin access will be limited to only individuals who reside in that cabin.
- Avoid sharing common items (cups, bedding, etc.) as well as the sharing of individuals' items with cabin mates.
- Cabins will be cleaned routinely.
- Personal belongings should be limited to essential items plus a limited number of non-essential items.
- Campers should keep personal belongings organized and separate from other campers' belongings.
- Campers will be participating in campouts 1-2 times a week.

Daily Camper Activities

- Camp groups will be no more than 7 campers to 1 counselor (most will be 6:1) and all groups will have their own "hub" for personal belongings and restrooms that will not be shared with another group. This will also be used for rainy day/indoor activities.
- Please send **LONG PANTS** and **CLOSED TOE SHOES** with your camper for Horseback Riding. We will **NOT** have clothing items available this year for sharing, If your child forgets these items they will **NOT** be able to ride.
- Campers will be allowed to bring their own horseback riding helmets from home. Our Ranch Manager will inspect for safety upon each use. Bike helmets are **NOT** allowed.

Meals

- Weather depending, most meals will be served outside.
- Meals will be served either grab n' go or family style and the counselor will serve meals at each table.
- Hands will be washed before eating and campers will be spaced out while eating.
- Campers will not attend meals if they are sick or experiencing flu-like symptoms. Meals will be provided to them separately.
- Campers will still participate in cookouts in small groups.

Cleaning and Disinfecting (Our Commitment To You)

- Hiram House will be following all CDC and American Camp Association guidelines for cleaning and disinfection.
- Daily activities such as archery, horseback riding, etc. will be cleaned after each group.
- Bathrooms and facilities will be cleaned multiple times throughout the day.
- Hand washing will occur throughout the day as needed.
- High touch surfaces will be cleaned multiple times throughout the day.
- All Camp Staff will be trained on cleaning and disinfection as well as a general Covid-19 guidelines.

Refund Policy

- Camp fees are non-refundable and non-transferable. In the event of a medical cancellation prior to the start of camp, \$10 of the deposit will be kept as a registration service fee. There is a \$20 charge for any non-sufficient funds checks. There are no pro-rated fees for campers arriving after the start of a session or leaving before its completion. There is a \$10 fee for any change after registration. Hiram House is not responsible for any lost or damaged camper property during the camping season.
